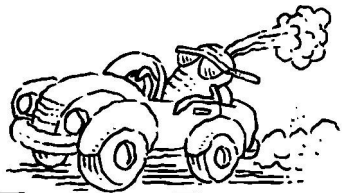

Gregg's Good News

This morning, we continue our look into the life of the Old Testament character Job. As he finally encounters God, God reveals himself to be more than Job can handle.

It strikes me that many people in the United States appear to have some sense that there is a spiritual dimension. However, the "god" that they define seems to be a god designed to fit all of their own human preferences.

Clearly, that god is not prone to offer any moral guidance in conflict with the person's preferences. Instead, that god is apt to stand in

agreement with all the person's own conclusions.

Which raises the question: Has the person truly met God? Or is the god being worshipped little more than worship of self?

 Watch for changes on Sunday evening. Beginning next week, the first 15 minutes together will be dedicated to learning new songs and practicing songs we've sung a few times. Following that, we will be watching a video series called "The Story" and discussing the insights we've gathered.

 Prayer themes for the coming week:

Mon., Oct. 13 May God supply leaders in the coming election who will govern with God honoring discernment.

Tues., Oct. 14 Pray for crime, abuse

and domestic discord to diminish in our community.

Sat., Oct. 18 Pray that our nation would experience an awakening that results in people from every state coming to Christ.

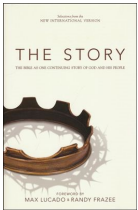
Sun., Oct. 19 Offer a prayer of praise to God for his mercy.
