“Back to the Future” was a trilogy of movies that centered on the consequences of time travel. October 21, 2015, was the date in the future that Marty found himself in. As a result, news agencies considered the similarities and contrasts between the imagined future and the current reality.

Flying cars and hoverboards (imagine a flying skateboard) are not commonplace yet. However, the typically hapless Chicago Cubs did make a deep run towards winning the National League pennant.

Yesterday, I was also thumbing through an alumni magazine that I receive from the University of North Texas. I first attended there in 1971 and graduated in 1981 with a break in between to work, get married and pursue other important things—like a deep relationship with God.

Pictures from the past reminded me of life expectations I carried decades ago as a college student. So many of them did not come true.

Last week at Life group, we were considering the “Lord’s Prayer” from Matthew. In the discussion of “give us this day our daily bread,” one person indicated that this statement reminded her to trust God for one day at a time.

Back to the future forecasts that didn’t come true, a young man’s expectations that didn’t materialize, and an insight from Scripture are all front of mind at this moment. They correlate with Prov. 27: 1 I read this morning. “Do not boast about tomorrow, for you do not know what a day may bring forth.” It truly does sound like timeless truth.
