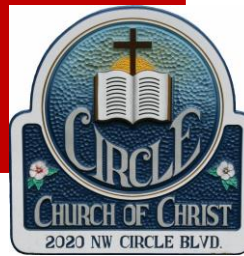

Over the years, I have listened as various people spoke of the importance of "Vision Casting." The idea, as I understood it, is describing a vision to a group of people so that they can have a sense of what the organization is moving towards.

Examples of "vision" I have heard often sounded more like a wish list or a series of expectations a person had made up, then demanded God to meet. Somehow that did not strike me as appropriate.

But I was in a Deacon/Minister meeting recently. One point of discussion concerned "How do the specific tasks I do in my ministry fit into a big picture?"

That set me to thinking. There truly is value in all the members of a congregation having a common sense of purpose. Based on that need, I began wondering and asking God how to distill his intent for this congregation into a few words. Finally, one Tuesday morning the following concept began to settle in:

Later in January, I plan to devote a couple sermons to explaining the meaning and implications of those words. In the meantime, I invite you to one simple point of awareness.
