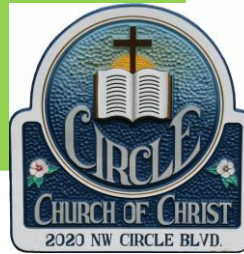

Some of us may wonder how best to interact with our own family members in light of their life choices. Others of us may be struggling with purity due to Internet sites or some other kind of habit that leads us towards wrong moral choices. Adolescents may be surprised at thoughts or feelings they are experiencing and wonder if they are "normal."

Mid-Valley Fellowship is an organization based in Albany. Duan Walker, the leader of the ministry, is a man I have learned to trust as both insightful and Godly. He and his team are willing and prepared to discuss the whole range of concerns I wrote about in the paragraph above.
