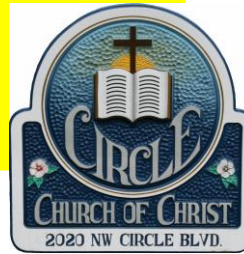

Gregg's Good News

It's most apt to happen when I am out on a hike. I begin to feel the irritant. At first, I try to ignore it even though I know the intervention that is needed. But finally I stop, pull off my shoe and look for the offender troubling every step I take. Sure enough, I find it. I am always amazed how tiny the rock is. Yet it is able to interrupt everything until I deal with it.

It seems to me that many life situations are similar. Wife and husband periodically circle around to the tension that never gets resolved. It isn't always a major problem that they face. Actually, it may be a small thing that lingers in a hidden corner of the relationship. But because they never deal with it, the irritation impedes the quality of their relationship. Dealing with it may be deciding to overlook a person's idiosyncrasies, but until the decision is made, the little things continue to be an irritant.

Dissatisfaction with one another in the life of the church can follow a similar pattern. You feel overlooked, a person speaks in a way that leaves a little stone in your shoe, or you just don't seem to click with that particular personality. As in marriage, it may be worth working out. Or deciding to overlook it may be a fine strategy. But do take the action that takes the stone out of your shoe.

I am not intending to speak from a political stance but rather from a Christian/moral stance. It feels like discontent, disagreement, fear and violence are high now in our nation. I am not wise enough to know all the "stones in our shoes" behind this. But as a Christian, I know the first response is to pray to Almighty God. Then allow the prayer to move ME to take the actions of Jesus and speak the words of Jesus to everyone. Peacemakers know that peace with God is a crucial first step if people would be truly reconciled to each other.
