Gregg's Good News

What do you want to be doing when Jesus returns?

It might be easier to answer the question, “What do you NOT want to be doing when Jesus returns?” Clearly, engaging in an unholy activity is NOT what to be doing at that moment when time comes to an end.

If that is the case, then it makes sense to not engage in unholy activity. Fact is: Jesus will come like a thief in the night—unexpected. So, when other reasons to live the holy life fail you, perhaps your fallback motivation can be, “I do NOT want to be doing this when Jesus returns.”

In addition, I do NOT want to be regretting the fact that I did not become a Christian. I do NOT want to be regretting the fact that I never bothered to help friends and family become Christians. So, the alternative is to get on with those actions today. Back to the original question, “What do you want to be doing when Jesus returns?” Jesus makes it clear that even He does not know the moment when time will reach the ultimate conclusion. In light of that, he recommends, “Keep watch.” (Mk. 13:32-37)

But what does “Keep watch” look like? Climbing to the top of Bald Hill and staring into the sky for the rest of our lives? When Christians in Thessalonica decided that keeping watch meant not working, Paul replied, “If a man will not work, he shall not eat.” (II Thess. 3:10)

Actually, Jesus had quite the opposite in mind. His sense of keeping watch was as simple as being a person who is continually walking the Christian walk. Continually choosing to do the holy action. Continually choosing to flee immorality. Always living to see service opportunities and follow through. Living the life of Jesus 24/7. To sum it up in language you have heard me use before: “Every member on mission every moment.”
