Jeremiah 32:14 says, "Take these documents, both the sealed and unsealed copies of the deed of purchase, and put them in a clay jar so they will last a long time." Amazingly, there has been another cave found with the Dead Sea Scrolls. Cave 12 was uncovered last month with more clay pots that had been used to protect the scrolls. This is a great discovery for the Textual Critic community. They also are looking for cave 13 which they believe has a hidden entrance.

As these discoveries are made, I like to remember what Alexander Campbell said years ago, the Bible "is a book of facts, not of opinions, theories, abstract generalities, nor of verbal definitions. It is a book of awful facts, grand and sublime beyond description. These facts reveal God and man." (*Christian System*, 17) Remember the gift you have.
