Gregg's Good News

Our time is an incredibly precious commodity. I don't hear it frequently any more. But in the past, the question "What are you doing?" was occasionally answered, "Oh, just wasting time."

Usually that meant the person was simply taking a laid back approach to life at that particular moment. We would do better to realize that things like taking a break from the treadmill lifestyle or catching our breath do not have to be identical with "wasting time." We were not designed for the "book every moment of every day" life that seems so common currently.

Years ago, I read a book by Gordon MacDonald called Ordering Your Private World. The author made the point that the only way to have something valuable to offer another person when you were together was to make sure you had space for renewal by God when you were alone. The person who is perpetually busy with activities is not well suited to bring the best insights from God even if that's the most needed thing in the moment.

Col. 4:5 calls us to "make the most of every opportunity." The emphasis that follows is being wise about how you interact with non-Christians, including how to speak with them. But the verses just before emphasize devotion to prayer. God calls us to the awareness that we are more apt to be present with other people in positive ways if we have taken the time to be alone and renewed by Him.

Are you a tired Christian? If the answer is "Yes," open your eyes to the pace of life you are choosing. Check to see if there is any space for "wasting time" with God. And swim upstream against the trend to turn all of life into a non-stop pursuit of busyness.
