When a church is seeking a new staff member, early in the process a congregation must spend time understanding who they are and who they believe God wants them to be. "Who is this congregation? Here are a few answers I suggest.

4. We are a congregation with a long-term commitment to Campus Ministry. Over the years, we have impacted students from OSU, LBCC and WOU locally. In addition, UCC sponsored retreats have drawn students from many other campuses. This effort is intended to both strengthen current Christians and reach to people at a time of life when openness to faith tends to still be flexible. The idea "Changing the World By Communicating Christ: From Corvallis to the Continents" has in part been fulfilled by students coming to Corvallis where we have invested in them and then going from Corvallis to serve in various congregations around the world.

5. This congregation attempts to both hold to the unchangeable core aspects of Christianity while leaving room for differences in matters of lesser importance or opinion. It may come from the need for flexibility engendered by being a Campus Ministry church and being a church with numerous people coming and going that calls us to honor the uniqueness of each person while still pursuing a common mission. Given the rate of change we all currently experience, this flexibility must remain Scripture-informed as we boldly choose to flex appropriately.

6. Numerous opportunities for service and participation exist in the life of this congregation. A glimpse at the list of Ministries in the bulletin is simply a starting point for noting the broad-based collection of jobs available. Going forward, we could do better at connecting gifted people/people with interest with the various tasks.

'I was reading through a self awareness assessment when I realized how things quickly compound. The first step is forgetting my priorities. One priority I have is spending time with God in prayer and Bible study daily. When I fail to keep that priority and fill up my schedule with other things it leads to procrastination, avoiding people, and failing in other priorities. This leads to anxiety where I try to create crazy to do lists (I like to cross things off). It could also lead to depression, fear, judging others, and negative thoughts. This compounds into being super busy (making lists because I am procrastinating actually spending time with God), binge eating, spinning in negativity or busy thoughts. This leads to anger, being defensive, overreacting and feeling alone. It culminates with exhaustion and feelings of helplessness. So to make myself feel better I'm going to get away to the store or into the NBA finals.'

It's amazing how missing one simple priority of spending time with God can spiral out of control and lead to so many negative things. So, what do we do when we feel ourselves spinning down this road? Remember your priority and start right there immediately. When I spend time with God in the morning it brings peace and purpose to my day. When I pray with my family at night it brings completeness to the day. Do you struggle with this priority? Try trusting in God this week by spending time in the Word and prayer and see if the spiral lessens.
