Gregg's Good News

Mark 10:17-31 depicts the scene of Jesus interacting with a rich young man. The man chose to not follow Jesus after Jesus pointed out the way wealth was an obstacle to his eternal life. The disciples were stunned at the thought of riches being a hindrance to life with God. Eventually, Peter volunteered "We have left everything to follow you!"

"Truly I tell you," Jesus replied, "no one who has left home or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or fields for me and the gospel will fail to receive a hundred times as much in this present age: homes, brothers, sisters, mothers, children and fields-along with persecutions-and in the age to come eternal life. But many who are first will be last, and the last first."

Jesus reminds his followers that while we may have to leave family and fields to be true disciples of Jesus, they will be replaced.

Today is termed "Mother's Day." But it is a good day for us to recognize the high value of *all* women and men. In addition to those who are Mothers; for those of us whose Mother has already passed away; for women who have not borne children; and for all of us who are male-this is a "good news" promise from Jesus.

It reminds us that in the life of the church, ample family is available. We can all be and/or seek a Mother, Father, Sister, Brother, Grandma, Grandpa, Child, Grandchild, Aunt, Uncle, Niece, Nephew, etc.

I noticed an article earlier today proclaiming that the young generation is extremely lonely. Apparently, social media relationships are not completely sustaining. So, the promise of Jesus becomes all the more important in two ways.

1. Recognize the role you can play for other people. For someone, you can be the missing Mom, Dad, Sister, Brother or Child.
2. Receive the love and guidance God makes available to you through your family, His church.
