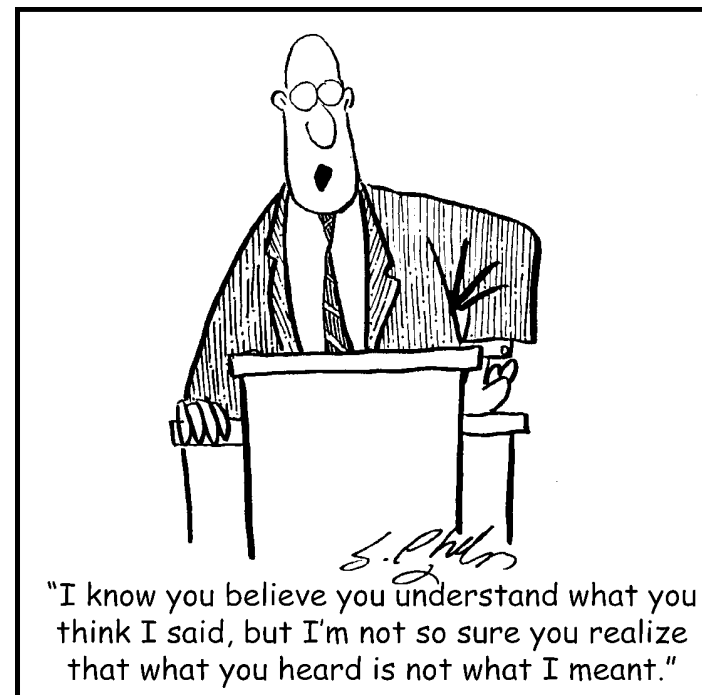

Gregg's Good News

I've started reading a trilogy with the first book called "Divergent." "Divergent", as well as the "Hunger Games" trilogy I read in the past, fall into the category of "Young Adult Fiction." Both have been popular enough to become movies.

My age may not qualify me to be pursuing "Young" adult fiction, but curiosity about the young people around me does. Both of these book series are set in a time period following serious war. They depict a situation of "dystopia." In other words, rather than humanity moving towards a utopian world where all is wonderful, the social and political world is seriously flawed.

This leads me to consider various questions I can't completely answer. Why is this worldview intriguing to young readers? Do young people find it easy to identify with the struggles and concerns of the characters in the story? Does the generation coming up suspect that the future will resemble the brokenness they are reading about?

I've come across two descriptions for the younger generation that give me pause: Fearful and Lonely. Immersion in the world of non-stop media and Internet news that brings video of the worst in every corner of the world could prompt fear in many of us. But loneliness in a non-stop social media world is less easy for me to understand. Until I recognize the meaning of the word "friend" has been redefined as someone I allow to look at my stuff rather than a trusted confidante I can allow to know the real me.

If fear and loneliness are indeed felt by the generation, the gospel still is good news. The past emphasis on relief from guilt likely matters less to people who define their own truth. It's now time to start proclaiming the gospel of pointing people to the Jesus who is more powerful than any storm of fear. And the church that is family is more faithful and available than anyone else you know; where no one has to remain lonely.
