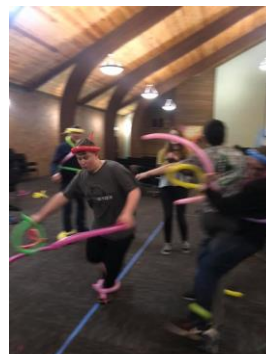

Gregg's Good News

There are two memories that penetrated my brain to the point that I can still feel the impact today. One was sitting in a dark upstairs room at Corvallis High School, viewing black and white film recordings of death camps for Jews during the Holocaust. Even younger, news coverage of black civil rights marchers being attacked by German Shepherd dogs and the blast from fire hoses.

I find it troubling when French President Macron states that anti-Jewish sentiment in Europe is as high as it has been since World War II. I find it troubling when a member of the U.S. Congress tweets out words that most Americans read as anti-Semitic. I find it troubling when the news media seems bent on separating Americans into sub-groups and fanning the flames of envy and dislike based on race, culture, or skin color.

Reconciliation of people of all kinds has been a work of God for a very long time. Eph. 3:6 reveals God's long-term mystery of Jews and Gentiles both one in Christ. 1 Cor. 12:13 states, "For we were all baptized by one Spirit into one body-whether Jews or Greeks, slave or free..."

As far as it depends on me, in the congregation we will flee anti-Semitism, racial strife and hatred of others just because we are not identical duplicates of one another. For if the body of Christ can get reconciliation to peaceful relationships right, perhaps the culture at large will get it too. Someone must lead. Why not the people of God?
