Gregg's Good News

Two Sundays ago, an Amtrak train travelling from Seattle to Las Angeles got trapped in the snow near Oakridge. The train hit a tree and stopped. Amtrak officials decided it would be safer to keep people on the train than to send them out into the snow. The town of Oakridge was suffering a power outage. Finally, on Tuesday afternoon, the train was able to return to Eugene and travel back to its point of origin. Comments voiced by various travelers as they exited the train were interesting.

One man hurried by the news camera with his most pressing complaint. "I haven't had a cigarette in 17 hours." There is an argument for steering clear of addictive habits. You never know when you'll be forced to abstain.

A later aged woman in business attire complained, "The Amtrak staff was not good at giving us information." Perhaps we could be more patient if we realized the workers on the train are just as stranded as anyone else. Plus, how and when an extreme situation will be resolved is also outside their ability to predict. Impatience rarely makes the clock move quicker.

One Mom's concern centered on the impending accident as she ran out of diapers. People helped. Children were restless. A woman pulled out her ukulele and serenaded her fellow travelers. A writer on the train commented "people are gathering into tribes." In other words, people started to connect with others. Some were playing cards, others were chatting, a few slept.

I like to think that those of us who are Christian would have fit into the actions of that final paragraph. If we all are facing a problem, impatience and frustration could rule your heart. A better approach: How can we love our neighbors here and now?
