Gregg's Good News

Some days after Jesus was born, his parents took him to the temple to consecrate him to the Lord. (The scene is recounted in the latter half of Luke 2.) That day, God sent Simeon alongside Joseph and Mary to speak. Simeon was a man who had waited "for the consolation of Israel." By the Holy Spirit, he knew that he would have the opportunity to see the Christ. What a moment it must have been when Simeon held baby Jesus Christ in his arms! It's always compelling to hold any baby for the first time—but how did it feel to hold the Christ child?

The fact Simeon erupts with a proclamation of praise answers the question. Simeon is now at peace with passing away and out of the world for he has seen salvation for Gentile and Jew alike. But then Simeon's language takes a turn. Speaking to other Mary, Simeon prophesies that Jesus will cause the falling and rising of many, he will be spoken against and in the process reveal the hearts of many people. Yet it's the final sentence that penetrates "And a sword will pierce your own soul too."

Here I perceive part of the wonder of the birth story. On one hand, we have

all the celebration that goes along with a newborn baby. Yet even as the star brightly shines, the shadow of the cross is over the scene. God in flesh was born to die. It is his purpose.

I'm not trying to rain on the celebration parade. I'm simply acknowledging that more than a seasonal story of one more infant, we live with awareness that God in flesh sets the stage for God on a cross. And in the process of his humiliation, God pens the door for our exaltation.

Lord willing, I am expecting to be out of the office Dec. 31 - Jan. 7.

CITE courses:

If you want to see how Biblical truths can have a positive impact on your family, take this class.
