Gregg's Good News

You drop a pebble into a pond. Without looking, you already know what to expect. A series of ripples will move away from the point of disturbance.

On a grander scale, an earthquake manifests as a major uplift on the floor of the ocean. The consequence is less familiar, but we've seen video from Japan. A tsunami surges across the coastline and significant waves crush buildings, carry away cars, and cause tremendous suffering.

There are moments in life when it may feel as if our actions will be of no consequence. We hope that the pebble we drop will go unnoticed by most people. But sometimes our actions become an earthquake.

Consider King Manasseh of Judah. He came to the throne after the death of his father; good king Hezekiah.

But Manasseh had a very different agenda. He rebuilt worship sites his father had destroyed. He facilitated worship of the Canaanite gods Baal and Asherah. He worshipped the starry hosts as the Babylonians were prone to do. Desecrating the temple, offering his own son as a sacrifice, and participating in the dark magic of sorcery and spiritism were also elements of his practice. In the process, Manasseh led the people astray "so that they did more evil

than the nations the Lord had destroyed before the Israelites." (II Kings 21:9)

The full effects of the tsunami were felt four kings later when Babylon came to destroy Judah. Yet II Kings 24:3 lays the wave of destruction clearly at the feet of Manasseh. His sins and all he had done were the cause. "... and the Lord was not willing to forgive."

Your actions bring consequences. Think twice before you stir up a tsunami.
