Gregg's Good News

There seems to be a mood in the air: a flavor of insecurity to life. It may be partly a consequence of more connectedness. We know within minutes of the latest earthquake halfway around the world in Japan.

But that awareness is unsettling because many of the events are demonstrations of heightened threat in comparison with what we've become used to in the recent past. Early this week, Russian jet fighters flew threateningly close to a U. S. warship. Iran continues to test missiles that could threaten Israel. The leader of North Korea sounds foolishly warlike in his threats. Terrorism in Europe has turned that former vacation spot into an area of concern. And by the way, even the IRS can't protect your personal information.

OK. I'm going to stop citing points of fear before I depress both you and myself. But I'm trying to prepare our hearts to hear this word from God. "Some trust in chariots and some in horses, but we trust in the name of the Lord our God. They are brought to their knees and fall, but we rise up and stand firm." (Psalm 20: 7-8)

Granted, the contemporary world is not threatened by chariots and horses. But those were the tanks and weapons to fear in the Ancient Near East. So the hope remains consistent. Trust God above all else. Trust God above fear of war, terror or natural disaster. Trust God when world leaders shout. Trust God when potential Presidents speak. Trust God. Trust God. Trust God.

Let's explore the worst case: Death. While I acknowledge it leaves a gaping hole in the lives of our loved ones... for the Christian, it's a quick trip home.

Last thought: If we can trust God for the extreme circumstances of life, can we also trust him to sort out the details of life in the church rather than getting riled up?
