

Gregg's Good News

Now, brothers and sisters, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, which you received and on which you have taken your stand. ² By this gospel you are saved, if you hold firmly to the word I preached to you. Otherwise, you have believed in vain. ³ For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, ⁴ that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, ⁵ and that he appeared to Cephas, and then to the Twelve. (I Cor. 15:1-5)

That reading of Scripture is so familiar I wouldn't be surprised if you skipped over it as soon as you recognized you've already heard it multiple times. If it's familiar, that's good. If you skipped it, let's slow down for a minute.

Consider the church in Corinth. It was easy for those people to look for the next wonderful insight from the new, well-spoken teacher. For Paul, "Jesus Christ and him crucified" continued to be the message of first importance.

I point us back to this Scripture and the central truths of the gospel for three reasons.

1. In this hurry up, get ahead, what's the next greatest thing to know or do world—nothing is as important or timely as knowing the answer to THE question. Am I in Christ? So long as you are dead in your sins, you are dead to stay. The death of Jesus is the one event of history that can save you from that fate. Why? "Jesus died for our sins."

2. You might misread that prior paragraph and conclude that Christianity is essentially all about life at some point in the future. But Jesus' act of saving you from your sins actually revolutionizes your present as well. Without the handcuffs of sin, you are free to become a "risen from the dead" person in the here and now.

3. Whatever deadly blow life is dealing you today, we who are Christian live with an ever present hope. Resurrection follows death.
