Gregg's Good News

Creation moves in rhythm. The sun comes up, the sun goes down. The tides come in, the tides go out. That comes as no surprise, for the Creator himself designed life to have a rhythm. For six days he worked at creation, on the seventh day he rested.

As I consider that sense of rhythm for the church body, it suggests several things. To begin with, we have just come through a season with lots of work to prepare and produce the Clothing Giveaway. 1001 people were served. So, it is reasonable to follow that with a "seventh day." Catching our breath and reflecting on the work God did during the preceding "six days" is right.

Yet the fact is that before the Clothing Giveaway, VBC was a big effort for some church members. In a healthy church body, one would hope that a different group bore the brunt of the Clothing Giveaway work while the VBC leaders had a "seventh day."

I am talking about rhythm in the life of the church. It is tempting to be content with one group of workers rising up for every major event. That is a recipe for those workers to wear out and walk away from tasks. A healthier model is for varying groups of people to be at the forefront of efforts, followed by a "seventh day."

("All hands on deck" events are good occasions for all of us to pitch in because some works are just too big for the leaders and a few more people to get the job done.)

Human bodies show the strain of "repetitive motion injuries." When you do too much for too long, the body is damaged. I appeal to church members who typically are content to watch others do the work: In order for others to get their "seventh day," your six days of work need to be done sometime or the body will be injured.

As the school year begins, the UCC building needs its annual repair time (Wed, Aug. 31). Guests will start appearing on Sunday morning who will need to be greeted and incorporated. Sunday "Meet, Greet and Eat" lunches will be starting in Sept.

Will that be Sabbath for the same people who rest most of the time, and another work month for the busy members of the body? OR will this body learn to imitate the rhythm of the Creator himself.
