Gregg's Good News

Proverbs 22:6 reminds us "Train a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not turn from it." "Start children off on the way they should go, and even when they are old they will not turn from it."

That verse comes to mind because I have noticed something very good recently. Last evening at the UCC clean-up, several parents brought their children along to work. During the Clothing Giveaway, there were also several children from Preschool age through High School present.

In both settings, the children were not simply present so that the parent could work. Rather, the children themselves were contributing in positive ways. At the Clothing Giveaway, they were passing out church invitations, processing clothes, carrying big loads, and more. At the UCC, children were clearing lockers, cleaning windows, working in the kitchen, sorting things, pulling weeds, and more.

When we hear the Proverb recommend "training," it is important to realize it calls for more than only verbal teaching. I believe that all these children were receiving training in doing good.

What difference does it make? I recall early life experiences of participating in Saturday building work days, pushing a wheelbarrow with gravel for the basement of the church building, walking with an older man through a neighborhood to leave invitations at each house. The feeling it left me with was that this was my church. And I was one of the guys. Ownership and acceptance. Who knows how much of that "start" helped me be a Christian today?

So I want to compliment parents who are training/starting children in good ways. And I want to thank organizers of service activities for recognizing that children are hard-working, effective teammates.
