



Gregg's Good News

Words truly are powerful. They are so powerful, that we must be careful how we use words. We must be wise when we speak.

Several weeks ago, I wrote about trying to discern what we assume is helpful in contrast with what truly is helpful. The words we use as we speak to others are an important aspect of the people helping task.

It is wise to pause before speaking so that you can understand the other person's mindset. In other words, at this moment, is the person deflated with discouragement or inflated to the point of exploding with pride? Is the person seeing the big picture of life or fixated on a tunnel vision of available options?

Eph. 4:29 calls us to use words that are "helpful for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen."

God places the expectation on the speaker. It is his/her responsibility to assess what words will benefit the listener and speak those. That is extremely valuable advice for people helpers.

Eph. 4: 15 recommends "speaking the truth in love." When a person is down, it may be very loving to offer encouragement. But when a person is stuck in a self-destructive pattern, clearly calling attention to the error and pointing out alternatives is the better course. Even if it requires the speaker to sharply cut through the fog of excuses and denial, that is the form that truth in love will take.

I've employed that second style of speaking less frequently. But when I do use it—in a context where the other person knows it is couched in genuine loving concern—it doesn't guarantee that person will employ the recommended action, but it does allow me to know I did what I could do. I offered genuine care with the goal of long term improvement in mind rather than a band-aid that will seal up the problem only until tomorrow.
