Is it just me, or does it seem like the volume of discussion is a lot louder than it used to be? If headlines or talking heads on the news are going to grab your attention, they feel compelled to out-shout the others.

When I say louder, I don't mean only in decibels. The language is strident, accusative and implying the absolute worst. Political types aren't colleagues, they are competitors. And if Hollywood starlets disagree with someone's recent post, they demurely post that the other person is "a moron."

(You can imagine the word that might fit there. I choose not to even partially spell it. ②)

OK. Granted, I am a Christian. So it isn't my job to evaluate the whole world. But in various places, I notice that the language of Christians is also coarsening.

Eph. 5:4 reminds us, "Nor should there be obscenity, foolish talk or coarse joking, which are out of place, but rather thanksgiving." Whenever I read this, it makes me cringe at how common put-down humor is among guys. And some Christians have assimilated OMG literally or watered it down to "Oh my Gosh" with the expected pause in between the syllables.

I like the verse because it reminds me what to do instead of ragged talking—thanksgiving.

Imagine that the next time you are tempted to devolve to the quality of speech you are hearing from the TV news or reading on Facebook, you instead express thanks.

Who knows? If the church can somehow continue to speak in measured tones even as we disagree with loud-mouthed cultural icons, perhaps civility may one day return to public discourse.

To confidently and joyfully share in God's glory by following His ways. We rejoice in trials as the Holy Spirit walks with us. We endure in suffering as the Spirit comforts us. We have great power to love as we meditate on the love God displayed by sending Jesus to die for us while we were still sinners (Rom 5:8). We have a new relationship with God, a loving Father to...? A trusting child, a rebellious child, an ignorant child. Which will you be? It will affect your life now and your daily decisions.
