Gregg's Good News

Years ago, I remember a couple of older Christian men who often summed up the life of a Christian with this simple phrase: "Be a servant." It was a sentiment that often found its way into their teaching.

The idea is rooted firmly in Jesus' own thought. After describing the hierarchical style that functions so often in organizations and life, Jesus suggested an alternative. "Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be slave of all. For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many." Mark 10:43-44

I remember their verbal teaching in support of the servant lifestyle. But I also remember seeing them do things like welcome a homeless person to spend the night. Inviting a young prostitute on the run from a motorcycle gang to live with their family. Sharing a simple meal with a heart broken college student even when family finances were extremely tight.

The benefit to people in need in those examples is obvious. But what about benefit to the servant? It was often inconvenient for those people to be servants. People they served did not always treat them well. But what benefit did they feel? Why did they continue to serve?

I believe the answer begins right back at the words of Jesus. They understood that serving was imitation of Christ. And the response of those being served was not what determined the value of the service. Contentment with obedience and doing what Jesus would do was the "payoff" for their actions.

Tonight will be the final session on "Handling Stress." I plan to show a TED talk video that will give you insight that may save and lengthen your physical life, and prompt you to serve.
