Part 3, continued from last week

When a church is seeking a new staff member, early in the process a congregation must spend time understanding who they are and who they believe God wants them to be. "Who is this congregation?" Here are a few answers I suggest.

7. We are a congregation with people from many age groups. That is an asset in many ways. Children in the life of the church create a sense of hope for the future: Hope that the church will persist. A combination of ages allows older people to mentor and encourage younger people through life experiences that the older person has already gone through. As older people listen to younger people, it provides a wealth of insight to the current world that we are trying to reach with the gospel.

Some congregations were intentionally designed to target a specific age group. That is not us. The perceived advantage in targeting a group is that church leaders can design the church activities, worship style and schedule to suit that age group. For example, one college student told me she likes the church where she attends because she can go to church on Saturday night and sleep in on Sunday morning. Worship style, preaching topics, and which needy people to support are all shaped by the preferences or needs of an age segment.

Obviously, that is not us. So it leaves us with the very challenging question: How do we help people from many different age groups in the church feel valued and choose to be engaged in all the crucial aspects of church life?
