Gregg's **Good News**

I expect you've had one of those days, weeks, seasons of life also. The list of important tasks and activities gets ever longer while the number of hours and units of personal energy get smaller.


Typically, I go to Searcy, Arkansas for a few days in June to teach people planning to be vocational missionaries in East Asia. This year, the group does not have funds to fly me in and it was unclear if the training was going to occur. But just days ago, I learned the event is on and the hope is I can teach several sessions on video. Aargh! Which being translated is, "This is the extra task that puts me well over the top."

At times like this, I'm learning there are several things we can do.

- 1. Look at the giant task and break it down into more manageable units. For example: Find my misplaced notes, ask a capable video person to help, update the notes, etc.
- 2. It's a difficult one for me. But some things just have to fall off the table. It's not always easy to choose what those are. Remaining responsible in my primary tasks does stay on; appointments with non or new Christians are kept; events with people who are already Christian may flex. Trust in God and time alone with God is essential.
- 3. Avoid the perfectionism approach. "Anything worth doing is worth doing well" isn't always true. Some check list items just need to get done. What is easy?
- 4. A verse I found recently. I Cor. 16:13-14 "Be on your guard; stand firm in the faith; be men of courage; be strong. Do everything in love." That last sentence reminds me what must be the prime mover behind all the tasks. And when that is the prime mover, even the disliked tasks become less stressful.
- 5. As I was driving here this morning, I saw a young man carrying a 12 pack of Bud Light. So early in the day. I hope he wasn't going off to get drunk. The first half of the I Cor. verses remind us to watch out for sin (escape through chemicals, anger towards family) during high pressure seasons.
