Gregg's **Good News**

One of the common activities when we assemble is large group, corporate prayer. If you are newer to church, you may wonder why it occurs and how to participate.

The prayer honoring prayer requests is one way the Elders communicate their love and care for the congregation. You could view it as a demonstration of "love one another" between the person requesting and all in the assembly honoring the request. It reflects Eph. 6:18, "always keep on praying for all the saints."

At first glance, you may assume that while someone else is speaking out loud during corporate prayer the only thing you can do is listen. Another option is to learn to pray along with the person voicing the prayer. Here are 3 ideas I gathered from some of your Christian sisters and brothers. This is what they do during corporate

- 1. As an idea is voiced in the prayer, repeat the idea. Paraphrase the thought and make it into your own prayer.
- 2. Be prepared to say a hearty "Amen" at the end of the prayer. Saying "Amen" is your endorsement of the prayer. It means "truly" or "surely." When you add your "Amen" to the end of a prayer, it means you want what was said in the prayer to truly occur. If you anticipate voicing your agreement, it will help you consider the statements that you will be saying "Amen" to.
- 3. In the case of prayer requests, keep the habit of presenting those requests to God during the week. If you know you plan to bring the thoughts to God later, it will help you tune into the various details when they are first revealed.


If prayer is like a foreign language to you, practice prayer on your own. Imitating Jesus' prayer (Matt 6:9-13) is one way to start. From there, remember you are simply a child speaking to God, our Father.
