# Gregg's Good News

I do not typically express opinions related to the political realm. But there are moments when measures on the ballot come so close to Biblical considerations that I will express an opinion—not an official church proclamation—but *my opinion*.

While we are not a people required to obey the Old Testament Law, the Torah still offers timeless insights to the thought of God. Ex. 21:22-25 describes a scene where a fight causes a woman to have a premature birth. If the child does not live, the person causing the injury loses his life.

Abortion and exposing newborns to the elements until they died was well known in the Roman world of the early church. The Didache, an early Christian writing offers this comment. "You shall not murder a child by abortion and not kill one who has been born." – Didache (c. 80-140)

Contemporary religious ethicists consider situations where pregnancy threatens the life of the Mother. A medical procedure may be done with the primary purpose of saving the Mother's life. In the process, the procedure has the secondary consequence of a fetus losing life. Ethicists view that differently than a procedure done with the primary consequence of ending the fetus' life.

Currently, a measure on the ballot aims to end the use of tax funds for some abortions. Medically necessary procedures would still be paid for, but not procedures done for the primary purpose of ending the life of the fetus.

I admit that I am a person who does not like having taxes I pay used to pay for abortion as a method of birth control. I also recognize there are medical situations that need a nuanced approach. It appears the writers of this current measure worked to consider both situations.

Now some reflections. In our Tuesday night campus ministry meeting we have been studying the book of Luke. This week was the rich young ruler. This is a very challenging and convicting story. This was a man who had kept all the commandments in the Law of Moses perfectly (Lk 18:21), and yet he was condemned because he was unwilling to give everything to the poor. Jesus challenges him with these words, "You still lack one thing. Sell everything you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me" (Lk 18:22). How could anyone be so strict? Could anyone keep such a standard? The following explanation comes from Dave Clayton, minister at Ethos Church of Christ in Nashville: "There are two rich young rulers in this story, the man who comes to Jesus and Jesus himself." 'Jesus possessed everything, left the presence of God and the riches of heaven behind, lived as a pauper, and died with a crown of thorns. He isn't asking us to do anything he wouldn't do himself.'
