Do you ever take note of good going on in another person's life and feel a tinge of displeasure? "Why do they enjoy prosperity, good fortune and no needs while I wrestle with life? I wish we could trade lives."

Meet the sin of envy. I Peter 2:1 calls Christians to rid themselves of it. Titus 3:3 says living a life of envy belonged in our life before being saved by God in Christ.

Often, envy is a result of making judgments based on falsehood. Viewing only the exterior of another person's life won't reveal other realities that person deals with. What looks to be a perfect marriage on the outside may fool you because you aren't aware that couple also must work at living in oneness.

A lifestyle of owning the latest and greatest may look appealing, unless you also witness the credit card bills a person lives with. But even if the person can pay cash for items, you cannot know if your life would truly be better if you also had those possessions. Perhaps the possessions would possess you. Perhaps you would lose life flexibility if you had to maintain a house that big.

Envy can be an insidious sin. It sneaks into our hearts and the primary damage is first done to ourselves. We feel less joy and peace because we aren't experiencing what we assume to be "her life." But eventually, envy may sour our relationship as we start to dislike or debase that person because we feel frustration that we don't have "his life".

Feeling envy is falling for Satan's schemes.
