Gregg's Good News

I don't know how many hundreds of times I have done it. It is part of my morning routine nearly every day. The task is washing the lenses of my glasses. I am daily making the effort to get the specks and oil off. If I don't, they cloud my vision.

Jesus makes an interesting statement in Luke 11:34-36. "³⁴Your eye is the lamp of your body. When your eyes are healthy, your whole body also is full of light. But when they are unhealthy, your body also is full of darkness. ³⁵See to it, then, that the light within you is not darkness. ³⁶Therefore, if your whole body is full of light, and no part of it dark, it will be just as full of light as when a lamp shines its light on you."

I've often found those verses somewhat perplexing. But when I consider them with my practice of cleaning my glasses in mind, I may be understanding them better. When my lenses are clouded, I'm not seeing things as they truly are. When my lenses are clean, my vision is accurate. Cloudy lenses could lead me to completely misinterpret things I am seeing. As a result, my actions in response could be completely wrong.

Eyes that are not trained to see things under the influence of the light of God can easily misinterpret what is seen. Evil can look good and good lose its luster if your eyes have been under the influence of the darkness of the devil. But eyes that see with the light of God will illuminate your whole body, self and life. You will be "walking in the light." Good vision leads to good living.

That suggests a "to do." Do what it takes to keep your eyes clean and clear with each new day.
