Gregg's Good News

Psalm 8 opens and closes with a statement of praise. "O Lord, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth!"

It wouldn't be surprising if the Psalm was prompted by the Psalmist spending a night outside on a clear evening. He reflects on the majesty of the objects in the night sky. As the Psalmist feels so small compared to the creation, he poses the question: "What is man that you are mindful of him, the son of man that you care for him?" Why is God even aware that he exists? And more than that, why does God care for each and every human?

In part, he answers the question with awareness of man's role in the creation. Humans are created a little lower than the angels—but God has given us intrinsic honor. In addition, he placed us in creation to be stewards over the animals of the field, the birds of the air and beings that inhabit the seas.

Now, pause for a moment to bring this Psalm close to your own life. It reminds us that when we feel small and insignificant, we rest in the assurance that the same God who created us not only knows us, but cares for us. And even more, he depends on us to care for His creation.


With such insights within, it's no wonder the Psalmist praises the name of the Lord. Now that we also share those insights, let's join together this morning to praise the Lord.
