# Gregg's Good News

When Paul chose the metaphor of the body to describe the church congregation, he certainly chose a picture that is easy to relate to. My body is currently doing its best to "unwelcome" some virus that decided to take residence in my body. The familiar runny nose, cough and chest congestion is all too well known by most of us.

My current experience points my thinking in two directions.

On one hand, even though the way my body chooses to fight off the invader is uncomfortable (please pass me another tissue and some throat drops), it is essential that the nasty trouble-maker be eliminated from my body.

Both Jesus and Paul warned us to be wary of people who tell a good story but don't have the best interests of the church body at heart. Jesus called those people wolves in sheep's clothing. Vigilance and emphasis on true doctrine are always appropriate.

The second idea this illness brings to mind is the interdependence of every body part. I don't pay attention to breathing so long as every body part is working well. But currently, the funky junk in my nose and chest makes me less able to get the oxygen from the air into my blood. I can feel it in the fact that my energy is not as high and my thinking is clouded.

In a similar vein, as each part of the church body does its work, congregational health is high. But when even one member of the church backs away, the rest of us may not even know why things are not as good as usualbut when one member is missing, we are all diminished.

Due to several requests I received, we are studying Revelation on Tuesday nights this term.

It's interesting how certain books become almost stereotyped in peoples' minds. Revelation is a great example. If you ask most people what Revelation is about, they would say the end times, and they are not wrong. Also, the writing of Revelation conjures many images, most of which are scary to think about.

Last week, however, we read a couple passages that lend themselves quite easily to praising God joyfully. One such passage is Rev. 1:7: "Look, he is coming with the clouds, and every eye will see him, even those who pierced him..." Before reading this passage, we sang "The Lion and The Lamb", the chorus of which talks about Jesus coming on the clouds and every knee bowing down to him. Rev. 1:8 says "'I am the Alpha and the Omega' says the Lord, 'who is, and who was, and who is to come, the Almighty". There are countless worship songs that use these phrases!

Even though Revelation can be a scary book, we still find passages that show us how good God is and how worthy of praise He is. The same is true in your life too. Even in the scariest of times, we can still find reasons to praise God.
