Gregg's Good News

I used to drive my children crazy. I was continually asking, "Now what kind of lesson can you learn from that?"

So I'll apologize in advance. But there was an incident in the news this week that showed the world way. There was rush to judgment, opinions voiced in explosive ways and even death threats against the individuals involved. For me, it calls forth the need for knowing and practicing the Christian counterpoint in contrast to the world way.

The scene was the encounter between a high school student from Kentucky and an older Native American man playing a drum in Washington, DC. News groups and social media immediately levelled accusations at the student due to his hat and his "smirk." Then the narrative spun the other direction, and shouts of accusation were pointed towards the older man. Next, the "bad guys" were another group not even seen in the original picture.

I doubt a scene like that can be completely unraveled. But Scripture reminds us:

"He who answers before listening-that is his folly and shame." (Prov. 18:13)

"My dear brothers, take not of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry. for man's anger does not bring about the righteous life that God desires." (James 1:19-20)

"But the wisdom that comes from heaven is first of all pure, then peace-loving, considerate, submissive, full of mercy and good fruit, impartial and sincere. Peacemakers who sow in peace raise a harvest of righteousness." (James 3:17-18)
