Thomas' Thoughts on

Labels

Democrat. Republican. Rural. Urban. Educated. Millennial. Gen X. Baby Boomer. Single. Married. Rich. Poor. Christian. Unbeliever.

What you just read are simply either nouns or adjectives used to describe people, though I'd imagine certain ones had more meaning ascribed to them than simply the word. We all do this, taking a description and then assigning value (or not) to it. However, we don't all do the next step, which is incredibly important in relationship, civil life, and evangelism.

This week I was listening to a world debate champion talk about the keys to winning a debate. I'd be happy to share the link with you if you ask. Julia Dhar says that she believed the key to winning was attacking the other person with extreme positions. But she came to understand that the way to most effectively reach and persuade people was something rather simple: finding common ground. She says, "People who disagree the most productively start by finding common ground, no matter how narrow it is; they identify the thing we can all agree on and go from there." One may think this obvious, except it's quite obviously not practiced in many areas of today's discourse.

There is a Biblical precedent for this. When Paul writes that he became all things to all men to save some in 1 Corinthians 9:22, he doesn't mean that he physically became weak or became sinful to reach those in sin. He means he found something in common. We see this in Acts 17 when Paul is in the midst of an extremely pagan Athens, and instead of calling them out on it, he calls them religious, like he is. No matter how different or narrow, we read of Paul constantly making a connection point from which to preach Jesus.

Shouldn't Christians be different than the screaming, polarizing talking heads of the news shows? Shouldn't our Facebook feeds be different than those constantly tearing down "the other side"? Shouldn't we stand out by what we are for-connection, relationship, humility and love-rather than what we are against? Like God becoming human to make us like Him, let us find what we have in common with all people so that Christ may become common between us as well.
