Gregg's Good News

When I was a youngster, a family member liked to play Monopoly with me. I never won. In part, that's a reflection of the fact that he was 7 years older than me. His strategies for accumulating real estate and money were superior to mine. But as I got older, I realized there was another reason for his success. He was always the banker for the game. And during every financial transaction I wasn't paying attention to, he managed to give himself a little extra money.

At that young age of life, his philosophy was, "If you can cheat and get away with it, it's just part of playing the game well." To his credit, he grew beyond that to honesty.

Recently, a scandal came to light concerning college admissions. Various high-income families bribed college officials to secure admittance or paid a "ringer" to take qualifying tests for their children.

Reactions tended to fall into two main camps. Many people were upset that such dishonesty had likely kept deserving students from admittance to various schools. Others were more matter of fact. They acknowledged that the rich have long been able to buy a spot for their children at university.

The latter insight is a reflection of "If you can cheat and get away with it, it's just part of playing the game well." When that mindset is held by a grade schooler who later repents, I'd call it part of maturing. When that mindset is held by Adults, I'd call it sin.

That takes me to my foundation point of the article. The solution to this infraction and the too common comfort with dishonesty will not be found in more laws. The solution will be found in more people acknowledging Jesus as Lord. "Changing the World by Communicating Christ—From Corvallis to the Continents."
