

Thomas' Thoughts On

Connected in Koinonia

There's a good friend of mine who's condensed media names social PinstaSnapTumbleMvTwitFaceTube (say it slowly if you need to and remember to breathe). Regardless of what you think of social media (or that amalgamation), it's correct to say that modern society has more ways to connect with others than at any other point in history.

One might then wonder why, according to a 2018 study, 46% of Americans feel lonely, and Generation Z, those between the ages of 18 and 22, polled in highest with nearly 60% reporting feeling disconnected and alone. The global health company Cigna calls that an epidemic.

It's interesting, then, to note that the Biblical word for fellowship, koinonia, isn't just about being a part of the same church or knowing one another, but is the idea of participating in one another's lives based on something in common. Put another way, you don't have true fellowship with someone unless you're involved in their life, all based on Christ being in your life and you in His.

Imagine if social media 'relationship' was replaced with even just a little bit of true koinonia. Instead of simply liking a picture or clicking the 'sad face', what if we actually called one another, were present in each other's lives, and participated in living with one another? One may think "Don't we do this?" According to people who need koinonia most, no, we don't. But we should, especially Christians, to each other and to those pining for true relationship and love.

This week, be challenged to step up and be present in each other's life. Call someone with encouragement, take them out for coffee or tea, partner in living in Christ together. Do this with someone for the first time. Be present with those in sadness, rejoice with those in gladness. Let us not settle for a quick "LIKE" as we soak in a thousand shallow relationships, but participate in truly living life together in Christ. I think God would 'LIKE' that.

Speaking of participating, remember that tonight is the fundraiser dinner for UCC, a ministry geared towards trying to connect with those currently of the loneliest generation. Praise God for your support in keeping it going!
