Thomas' Thoughts On Easter Sunday 2019

I pray everyone had a wonderful Easter Sunday. What a privilege to worship our risen Savior together as a family here in Corvallis as well as across the world.

Unfortunately, on Easter Sunday in Sri Lanka, over 350 people were killed while doing the very same thing we were that morning. Over 500 people were wounded, and the victims ranged in age and nationality. I encourage you even as you read this to stop and pray for their families.

While reasons for attacks like this are many, historically one of the main reasons is to instill a sense of fear and despair among the victims. Fear equates to control and power. But, I have no doubt that the majority of Christians will be back at services today in boldness wherever they're held, and the reason is the same reason they were at services the previous week.

Christ's resurrection reminds us where true power lies, and that no worldly power can control those who belong to Christ Jesus. I'm reminded of Romans 8:38-39 in which Paul lists a myriad of things that cannot separate us from the love of God in Christ-powers and death are included in that list.

In light of this tragedy, we pray, and we pray hard, for the persecutions Christians and innocents face. We pray for God to work mightily through this horror, and that the church may grow in faith and number, showing the perpetrators that they truly are powerless. We pray in boldness, acknowledging the fear we or others may feel, but knowing that the love of God can and does overcome even our greatest fears. The message for the world is clear: even in death, God's people cannot be defeated. After all, that was the same message given the world 2000 years ago on the first Easter, when a dead man became our risen Lord. Grace to you.
