Gregg's Good News

Many years ago, I met a man who was something of a drifter. He was in Corvallis but spent the better share of his time in Portland.

I had prepared a simple lunch for him to eat while we conversed. Wanting to make the most of the opportunity, I asked him if he had a relationship with Jesus. Without missing a beat of spoon to mouth, he said, "Oh yeah, I got saved 20 or 30 times." Apparently he would repeatedly raise his hand after dinner at the mission when asked to signal his faith in Jesus. I can't know for certain, but it didn't seem that getting saved had much effect once he exited the mission's doors.

In the writings of Paul, salvation is depicted as an ongoing reality. To begin with, when we repent and are baptized, God saves us from the eternal condemnation and death that is the wages of sin. From that point, God is saving us. The process of sanctification continues as the Holy Spirit transforms us away from the evil that used to control us and moves us towards daily imitation of Christ. Finally, death or the return of Jesus will take us out of our current existence so that we will be utterly saved—having no risk whatsoever of deciding to give up the faith.

But it seems many people, like my friend eating the soup, get stuck at the moment of conversion and fail to understand how to live as a saved person. Saved people are called to a bigger adventure than simply waiting for the heavenly reward. Today, Thomas is starting our new sermon series called "Saved For". Our aim is to point out various aspects of life saved people can pursue in the here and now.
