Thomas' **Takeaways**

I was reading this week of a father and son in Boston whom, when returning home, found the door unlocked and their home broken into. They entered cautiously to find...their home pristinely clean. "Rugs were vacuumed, everything was neat and put away," the father said, and the cleaner/criminal even made roses from toilet paper in the bathroom (which the father kept as a souvenir). The father believes a professional cleaning service simply came to the wrong address, but the case is...clean, so to speak. I might not mind coming home to this!

Now, I'm not suggesting you break into your neighbors' house and clean their toilet while they're not home, nor do anything that's otherwise illegal, but I do wonder if the reason this made the home page of CNN is because it's a story that both is unusual and yet ends well.

Mark 4:26 speaks of a man who throws seed out in his field and goes to sleep. He knows not how it grows and does nothing to help it, yet it grows. This parable reminds us that we're not responsible or sometimes able to influence what the seeds of faith do once planted, but we are responsible to intentionally scatter and try to plant seeds in any way we can. I know that people who are served by Christians in unexpected ways sometimes think it unusual. Sometimes we're able to bless people in big ways, but perhaps most unusual of all are the everyday, small and simple acts that still catch people off guard but, unlike the story, they know who did it and why: someone living in the grace of Jesus' resurrection who seeks to show you who Jesus is.

They're unusual because, while we look for sensational stories like this one, living out and serving Jesus in the everyday grind of life IS unusual. Also unusual is that God says through these small, mustard seed actions, perhaps a seed could be planted that grows into eternal life.

What doors could we 'break' into by a small act of service and blessing pointing them to God? CNN might not cover it, but the effects might last longer than any news story...or house cleaning.
