

Gregg's Good News

The word "metanarrative" is being used by contemporary philosophers to describe an overarching story that gives context, meaning and purpose to all of life. I find it an interesting concept because for those of us who are Christian, the overarching story of God and humanity from the Bible serves that purpose.

The context of our existence is that we were created by a good God. As a result, we find meaning and purpose for life based on relationship with him. We prize the voice of our Creator as proclamation of absolute truth. We exist to internalize the truths of Jesus and live out those truths in relationship with the rest of humanity. That is purposeful since our lifestyle displayed and words spoken to reflect him are intended first of all to lead us to life which is "abundant". In addition, our lifestyle and words are intended to be appealing to those we meet. An appeal to others to know, worship and experience intimacy with God as well as community with the people of God.

But the story that shapes us is not the only story being heard. Another meta-narrative begins at a different place. As a result of occurrences of chance, life began on our planet. The end result of many occurrences of chance and adaptation is the existence of humans. Without a prime mover to our creation, truth is flexible. It becomes an agreement among humans at any particular moment in time or the agenda of a few, but loudly declared over and over. It appears to me that the consequence is to see the purpose and meaning of life as totally about the here and now. Ethics can be very flexible since maximizing the ability of a person to experience life the way s/he deems the fullest and most satisfying is the priority.

Why bother to acknowledge this? Because we might miss the bigger question at hand and consequently, fail to offer the ultimate answer.
