Only Being Smart Isn't Smart

I'm a fan of podcasts. I enjoy variety and the convenience of being able to listen and learn from so many different people. This week I came across "At the Table with Patrick Lencioni." Lencioni being the author of one of my personal top 5 teamwork and leadership books *The 5 Dysfunctions of a Team*, I tried out a few episodes and wanted to share with you something from the first episode called "Being Smart is Overrated".

In short, Lencioni and his panel make the case that the smartest organizations don't always thrive the best, but the ones that truly believe and create organizational health do. I won't get into the weeds, but organizational health is a *culture* that a whole organization believes in and reinforces. They make the case that success in any organization isn't just about being able to be smart or make good decisions, but that healthy organizations will naturally flourish due to the culture people enjoy participating in that naturally will attract customers (for businesses) or members (for churches).

As I was listening, I couldn't help but connect this discussion to a study Barna has just completed from 15,000 Christians across 6 continents, ages 18-35. One of the major findings was that *what* the congregations taught (smartness) was not as important as how the teachings influenced the lifestyles of the members. Put another way, the culture the teaching was found in and affected mattered more than the teaching itself. Should we be concerned about doctrine and study? Absolutely, no doubt. But in modern culture, just as important is the culture within our congregation, families, and even our own lives.

What is the culture of Circle? If you weren't here, would YOU be attracted to it? What's the culture of your family? Of your Monday-Saturday life? Is it like the culture Jesus created when He taught to count others more important, love God with all you have, and love your enemies? We're seeing a trend that being right/smart about the Bible isn't what attracts people to Christ as much anymore. But what does is something that yet always has and will – living and showing a healthy culture of true eternal life. Some may even say it's smart! Grace to you.

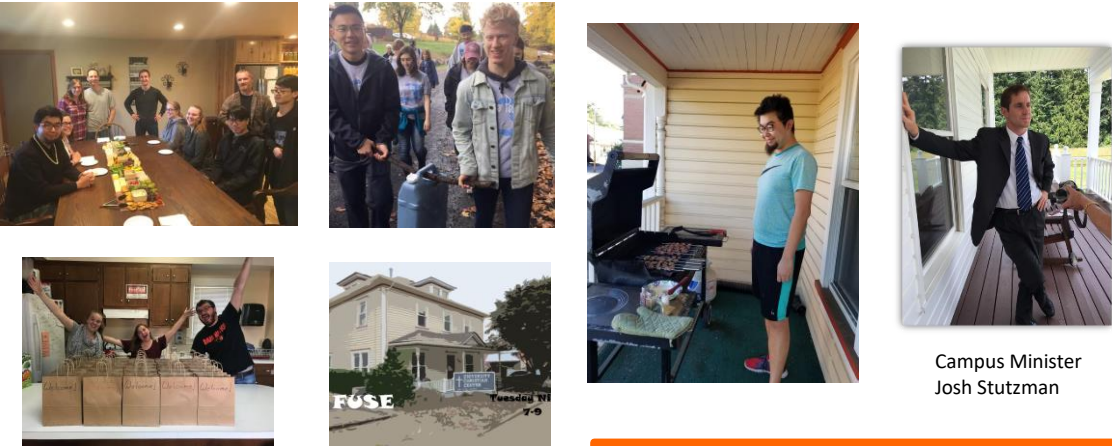
