Thomas' Takeaways

<u>Methodology</u>

"If western societies have become post-Christian mission fields, how can traditional churches become then missionary churches?"

-Darrel Guder, The Missiological Context

In the last decade, the term "post-Christian" has often been used to describe American culture. This isn't in relation to which belief or religion is dominant, but a society that at one point was rooted in the culture and practice of Christianity, but the beliefs and practices have been rejected and/or forgotten. This is different than a minority-Christian culture in that the root beliefs of a culture – human rights, relationships and marriage, for examples – which were taken from Christian morals are still there but are distorted and are largely impossible to intellectually justify. While there can be and indeed are millions of pages and pixels devoted to even unraveling those details, the question of how this cultural shift impacts churches is everpresent.

The quote above offers an interesting truth and challenge to modern churches. Put another way, times are changing, and while Truth does not and cannot change, every method that has been used for Truth's cause may at some point become outdated. We already see certain ways in which this is true – congregations that don't have websites are nearly instantly discounted or overlooked. Some congregations have gone too far – since even 2000 we've seen congregations that emphasized entertainment but had shallow Bible teaching close, their buildings still vacant.

I wonder if this is some of what Paul meant when he said he became all things to all men, that Truth never was compromised, yet no method of doing anything that Paul knew was "safe". I don't know nor am I suggesting anything in particular about our congregation or lives, but it's a question we must consider moving forward: what we may need to change, what might we not be willing to change in the ways we do things. Perhaps Paul would suggest starting with that first one. Grace to you.
