Thankful For...Ministry

When one thinks of ministry, many probably think of what happens at the church building, or perhaps those who have devoted themselves to ‘professional’ ministers, i.e. those paid on a church staff. That’s not how I mean it. Don’t get me wrong, I’m thankful I get to do this as a profession, but if I wasn’t being paid to do this, ministry would still be important to me, as I pray it is for you. Ministry, after all, is any and every activity intentionally done by any and every Christian out of and because of their faith.

I admit, perhaps especially as a paid minister, I struggle with where the harmony is between, let's call them 'organization ministry' and 'life ministry' for lack of better terms, OM and LM for short. OM requires people to give up their time, usually come to the building, and participate in something someone organized and set up, which took time and effort, to accomplish a goal, such as 30 food boxes for example. LM is more about as you go, more relationally than goal focused, and more about having chosen an action than necessarily the result it produces (I'm oversimplifying, keep in mind here), such as being able to quickly pray for your Dutch Bros barista in the course of conversation. OM connects Christians and they accomplish something together, LM develops yourself as a Christian and can create, sometimes slowly, personal opportunities. Neither is better than the other, but we must never overemphasize one to the detriment of the other.

When you get too busy doing good OM, that takes your fuel for LM. Likewise, certain worthy OM projects might fail if you're only about LM. As Christians, we are obligated to BOTH in our lives. Both have great impact, and both are good, but we must also choose to do both. I'm thankful for ministry because I get to be a part of those great moments where something happens because we all came together, but I'm also thankful for moments I'll know nothing about due to every one of you choosing to minister to someone at that moment. Let us be thankful for the ministries of each other's lives, that though we may not see them minister at the building, Christ is indeed shown, as well as those done together at the building. Let's choose to all do ministry this week, wherever we are. Grace to you.

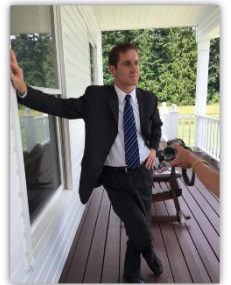

This year on Tuesday nights, we've been studying God's heart for outsiders in the Gospel of Luke. I was amazed this week at the consistency of Jesus. When Jesus starts His ministry in Luke, this is what He says He is going to do: "The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because He has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." (Luke 4:18-19)

Then, near the end of His ministry, He cleanses the temple. Take a look at what He does: "The blind and the lame came to Him at the temple, and He healed them. But when the chief priests and the teachers of the law saw the wonderful things He did and the children shouting in the temple courts, "Hosanna to the Son of David," they were indignant (Matthew 21:14-15).

Jesus started out His ministry saying He was going to proclaim good news to the poor, heal the blind, and set the oppressed free. When He finally entered Jerusalem, the first thing He did was kick the corrupt businessmen out of the temple and started healing the blind, the lame, and the children. So Jesus did exactly what He set out to do.
