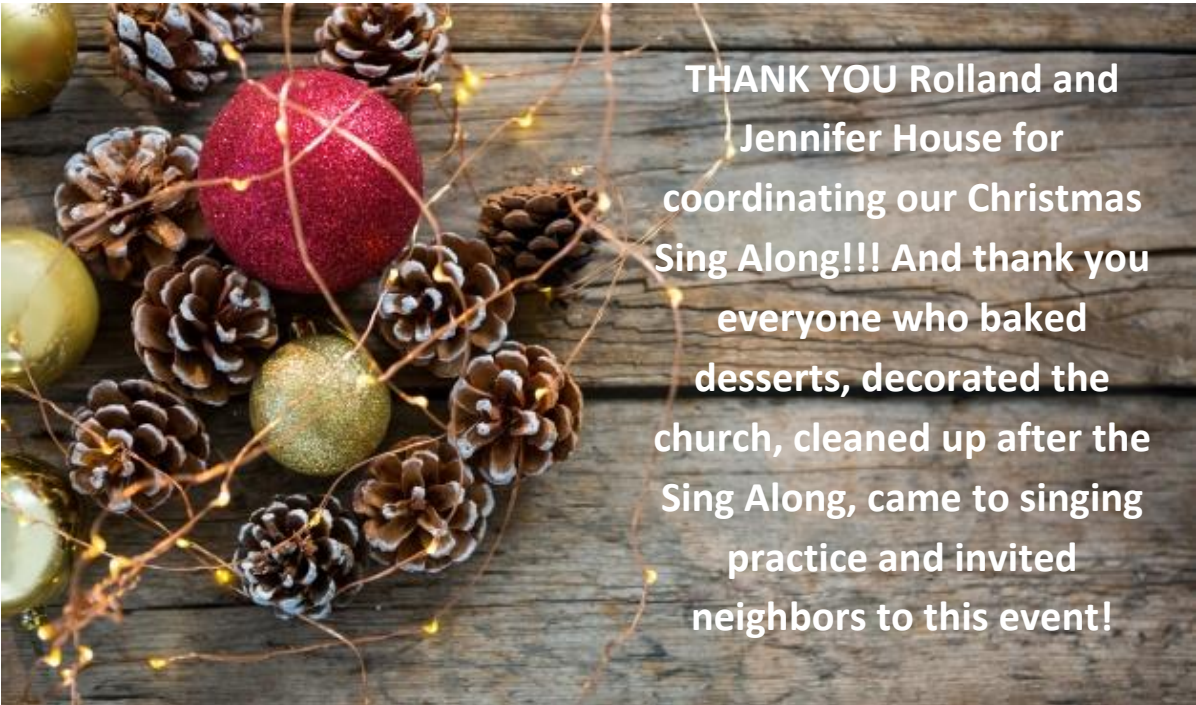

The Gift of Vulnerability

One of the temptations that social media presents us with is to craft our lives only in the way we want to be perceived. A quick Instagram post of a morning run might have really been a quick walk down the street then back to bed. There's a true story of a woman who 'faked' her way through a month-long European vacation without ever having left her bedroom. On social media, we control what people see and how they see it, completely.

Now some of you are saying, “Yep, that’s why I’m not on social media.” And some of you are saying, “I don’t do that on my account.” Fair enough and fair enough. But what about Sunday morning? Many people do the same thing as social media when we’re assembled. More than just the ‘how are you? Fine’ culture, do our Sunday selves reflect our weekly lives? It’s easy to see if someone’s being a hypocrite by being drug dealer the rest of the week, but what about when we’re struggling with life? What about when we’re caught in sin? What about when we’re sorrowful, anxious, angry, hopeless, nervous, depressed, uncertain?

True relationship, *koinonia*, deep relationship, dare I say intimacy, only grows when there is vulnerability. Then in turn, when vulnerability is honored by trust and safety. Therefore, this takes at least two people – one to be vulnerable and one to be trusted with that gift. But vulnerability comes with risk. It comes with surrendering our control of our perception, sometimes facing that which we're trying to hide even from ourselves, and knowing people may use your vulnerability against you. Those who abuse vulnerability indeed shouldn't be trusted with it. But it can't mean we never be vulnerable again, as that means we shall never have a deep relationship with anyone.

I've heard it complained that the church is shallow and uncaring. I'm not saying spout off all your problems to someone, but perhaps we can begin to turn the tide against shallowness this month. When using the gift of time, perhaps take a first big toe, if not step, towards true and deep relationship. And maybe even just start with Christ. Have you even been truly vulnerable and open with our Lord? Grace to you.
