Spiritual Resolutions

To the church that meets at 2020 NW Circle Blvd., welcome to 2020! The beginning of a new year is an exciting time, replete with new possibilities and the future ready to be written. I often wonder why so many people are so excited about the new year on January 1st, but by October 1st are just ready for the *NEXT* new year. I wonder what really changed, both between December 31st, January 1st and October 1st. My suspicion is that we are fixated, enraptured, and perhaps romanced with the concept of newness.

A NEW year, a NEW decade, a NEW month, NEW possibilities. Perhaps the cyclical nature of the calendar reaffirms a NEW cycle around the sun, though one can argue that October 1st, 2020 is just as new, as it's never happened before. Happiness is sometimes offered with the prospect of a new job, a new significant other or spouse, the newest phone or tech, or a new place to live. The problem is, regardless of what's new around you, you're still you. And you're not new to yourself. Your problems are still your problems, anxieties your anxieties, needs your needs, and desires your desires. I tend to think this is why resolutions are so popular, and why they don't work, because what's really different about 2019 than 2020 when it comes to your willpower, resolve or schedule?

Perhaps it's fitting that in the book of Lamentations do we read that God's mercies for our afflictions and inadequacies are new every morning, that great is His faithfulness, and that's what we hope in.
