Influential Memories

Today, while also being the first day of March, marks a few other events in the life of our congregation. Tonight is the UCC Mission Dinner to support the college group in their trip to Mountain States Children's Home. Today also marks the beginning of a new quarter in the CR-E-8 education ministry (Cradle Roll – Elementary - 8th Grade Bible classes). While these things are yet future, I'm also reminded of the past.

As I look back on my life, I find a surprising amount of memories from people whom I was never close to or have grown far apart now. Those memories, even from those who were hardly in my life, contain a surprising amount of influence. There's the community play director who publically chewed me out for forgetting my lines, teaching my 15 year-old-self that indeed I was accountable for what I didn't know, and no one cared for my excuses. There was that student in 8th grade who challenged me for my seat in band, winning it, and not only breaking up my friend and me (who goofed off a lot) but sent me down to 3rd chair. He and my friend played trumpet seriously well into college, but it became less fun for me and I stopped seriously playing in high school. There's the teacher in 1st grade who cast down a group punishment (though I'd truly done nothing wrong) that taught me the sting of injustice. These are random examples and while perhaps not the most influential, these still affect me more than other, more constant people or experiences did and do.

We will never know the full extent of our unintended influence on people, but what I do know that we can each be intentional about who we can influence for Christ, today. I remember the exact group of people, I can see their faces, who sent me on a mission trip to Mexico to build a house for a family, an experience I'll always treasure that profoundly changed me. I didn't have the privilege of growing up going to Bible class, but I'll forever remember those who have taught me most, both in knowledge and in how to live out the Gospel. Now, I'm not saying you need to donate to the mission team (though you should) and I'm not saying you must teach a Bible class (though you also should). But I am saying there are people right around you at this very moment you're influencing. Is it by accident? Is it towards Christ? And how will they remember it? Grace to you.
