Dear Church Family,

Our prayers are that the current outbreak of Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) is over sooner than later. However, until that is the case, we give these guidelines. **If you are sick and running a fever, please stay home and watch the streaming of the service** which is available live and taped at <https://2020circle.com>. If it would be better for you, even if you are healthy, to do the same due to your level of concern, feel free to do so. One precaution for those of us who will be attending is **that we have gone back to the pre-packaged communion cups for a while, or we will be using a double cup method** in which preparers wearing gloves will put a cracker in one cup and a separate cup with juice on top of the first cup. **We now want to ask that everyone pick up his or her own pre-packaged communion** before worship. **Please dispose of your own communion cups in the foyer garbage can.** We will make changes as needed as time goes on. **In the short run, wash your hands regularly**, bump fists instead of shaking hands, follow the above ideas as fits you, but please know that God is in charge. **Please continue to pray** that this virus goes away. We are still working out how to receive your contributions, but it's likely that the offering trays will be put out after communion and you can put your contribution in them as you leave.

Thomas' Takeaways

Time

There is one thing that I've found is even harder for people to give than their money. Indeed, many people will throw gobs of money at people and organizations and never part with this much more precious commodity, one that reveals to an even deeper degree what your priorities are and what you believe in. And rightly so, because unlike money, this can never be replaced, made up, or saved, which is why it's so precious. I am talking about time.

As anyone who listened to popular music in the early 20-teens knows, there are 525,600 minutes in a year. That sounds like a lot, but if you are anything like the people I know, most of your time is planned before it even begins. Let's take a look at the 1,440 minutes you get every day. We can automatically set aside 480 minutes for sleeping (if you don't sleep for 8 hours each night, you have the gift of more time than the rest of us!), so we have 960 minutes of being awake each day. If you work a 40-hour-a-week job, subtract another 480 minutes, and you are left with 480 minutes of "free time". If we stopped there, it would appear we have a very well rounded day: 1/3 spent sleeping, 1/3 spent working and 1/3 spent doing whatever we want. But that's not the reality I live in!

This “free time” can include many things we don’t necessarily want to do: running errands, cooking, cleaning, studying, doing homework, commuting, etc. But it also is made up of many things we enjoy, like spending time with our family and friends, pursuing our hobbies, or just scrolling through Facebook. It is this time in our days that shows the people around us what is important to us, for better or for worse.

What does your “free time” reveal about what your priorities in life are? What would your schedule reveal about what you believe in? And would you consider investing this much more valuable currency into the people you so generously support with your money? Would you consider investing this in each other? Money is a wonderful and valuable thing, but it cannot buy what time can: fellowship, mentorship, discipleship, and dare I say love. And, what’s more, unlike money, we already have as much of it as we’re willing to give. Grace to you.
