God and the Unexpected

I was scared last night. My heart jumped into my throat. I got chills, and I almost yelled out loud. When I went to brush my teeth last night, I closed the door but before I turned on the light I backed into something cold, wet, and horrible – it was some wet laundry sticking out of our laundry basket. Silly, but it scared me. The basket had been moved somewhere it usually isn't, and while I know the laundry basket with its contents is there, I wasn't expecting it THERE.

There are many things in life that we know are there and are aware of, but still can scare us when they pop up in places they weren't before. We hear and know about disasters, sicknesses, and accidents in many other places to many other people inn our world, but when they encroach upon the lives of people we love and indeed our own lives, those things are different. They're not just things we can pray about and offer help when they're close by, they're things that now WE may need the help for, and things that we begin to deal with everyday in real, tangible ways.

Unexpected things are a part of life, which is why it's so important to know and hold onto things that are constant. Hebrews 13:8 reminds us that Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever. He's no less our Lord in times of convenience and health than he is in times of sickness and disruption. 1st Corinthians 12 reminds us the church, and all of her members, are one body. That's no less true if we're meeting together day by day or if it takes months between seeing one another. Romans 12:1-2 reminds us to make our lives a living sacrifice which is our spiritual act of worship. Orienting our lives in worship to God is essential for joy and peace, especially in times of uncertainty and stress.

Today the laundry is in the wash, and the basket returned to its rightful place. As little fun as it is, we must deal with what comes our way, expected or not. But we as Christians must not lose the confidence and trust in the things that we can always expect – that God be God over this world, that Christ redeems us, that the church will go on being the church, perhaps in good unexpected ways, that prayer IS powerful because the God we pray to is, and that tomorrow the sun will rise again. We can persevere against whatever the days bring because the Son rose once already. And even His laundry was taken care of (John 20:7). Grace to you.
