



I'm ecstatic to again report that last week's mission dinner, complete with amazing desserts, giant pinatas, and many people being reminded of how poor their Spanish is, raised \$5,800 for the UCC's mission trip to Mountain States Children's Home, their goal being \$5,500. As one who happens to believe in the concept of supporting people to have experiences that will impact and shape their walk with Christ, I thank you deeply for your generosity and support for this cause.

While I'm sure there's a pithy saying somewhere that could say it better, what people truly believe in is often revealed when it comes to their bank accounts. This is true in politics, in charities, in education, and yes in churches. There's something different about simply saying you believe in a mission or a person versus giving your hardearned money. Even in my personal experience of raising support, people will believe in your vision 99%, but that last 1% is enough to keep them from donating.
