Productivity

The last few weeks have seen several shifts. The first one was obviously being quarantined as we're able, and adjusting to a new work schedule, new home life, new social/lack of social activities, and navigating our new hyper-digital world, among other things of course. Then people have gotten used to it, and work for many people has resumed to or even more than its previous cadence. Frustrations have come in methods and approach to regular work exacerbated by distance working, and home and work lives have been bleeding into one another. For as many who have had a fairly easy time, there are others who can't wait to go back to 'normal' because it was just downright easier!

That last point has particularly stuck with me this week. This week, I've been incredibly non-productive (I feel like). I've struggled to get stuff done, struggled to take the time away from my family at home to seriously study, read, and create the sermons and lessons I need to. Meanwhile, the grass needs mowed, projects around the house are undone still, and my five children are starting to get a bit of cabin fever, constantly wanting, as they should, Mom and Dad's attention and time. Yesterday, I was grumpy due to my lack of productivity. When three of my kids asked to go on bike rides, which they need us out there with them still as 2/3 are with training wheels and the older one isn't the most confident on two wheels, I didn't want to. I grumbled in my head about the things I haven't gotten done and needed to do, but they had been looking forward to it all day.

What was something I was unhappy about doing turned into the first time I rode my bike along with my two sons, one extremely savvy with his training wheels and the oldest finally getting confident on his own. It's a moment I'll look back on for the rest of my life. And I didn't want to do it.

I'll admit, I don't have a Bible verse or some transcendent principle to connect this to today. Maybe I'm writing this just to tell you it's challenging anyway to harmonize work, family, and life. But I constantly need reminders about what will matter years from now, and those things are rarely ever what I got done at work that day, and nearly always things that have to do with my relationships with God, with my wife, and with my family. Today needs to be a productive day workwise. But I'll know my answer this evening when my kids ask to go ride bikes. Grace to you.
