Thomas' Takeaways

"Here I Am...Stuck In The Middle With You..."

Whether you have clowns to the left of you and jokers to the right depends on your family, but sometimes the middle is the hardest place to be. This is our 10th consecutive Sunday of exclusively digital Sunday services. Oregon's COVID-19 plan may allow for larger gatherings in the coming weeks, or may not. Of course, just because we *can* do something doesn't mean we *should* do that thing. Paul made that point clear, rebuking the Corinthian correspondence which claimed, "All things are lawful" to which Paul responded, "but not all things are beneficial," in 1st Corinthians 10. While it's a simple principle, it's hard to work and think through well. That is the main concern of your staff here at Circle – not just to be concerned about what we can do, but what will continue to be most beneficial and encouraging to the whole congregation. And we're not all that sure about a lot of things.

The middle is often the hardest place to be, particularly when you're not all that sure if you're truly in the middle, closer to the beginning, or nearing the end. In truth, sometimes even when you know you're in the middle it can be hard (I was climbing up the side of a steep hill the other day thinking I was closer to the road when in fact I was juuuuuuust over halfway. I made it though, obviously). We may be in the middle of this, maybe closer to the beginning yet or we may indeed be closer to the end. We just don't know.

Especially when we don't know, it's all the more important to focus on what we do know. Not just of who God is, what He's done for us, or how to come to Him, but also to realize that how we finish each stage of life we find ourselves in matters. The principle of finishing the race applies just as much to a marathon as it does a 40-yard dash. Whichever one we're in right now and wherever we are in it, let us by God's grace make whatever remains better than what has come before. Let us as Christ's church strive ahead towards each and every morning ready to meet God in and throughout each day. Let us focus every moment, in and out of quarantine, cruciformly that every moment may be His. And then when this stage passes, let us celebrate, refocus, and continue to strive together. As we've been doing throughout. Grace to you.

Rick Warren's Purpose Driven Life contains a convicting chapter on service. He says, "Imagine if your liver decided to start living for itself: "I'm tired! I don't want to serve the body anymore!
