## Thomas' Takeaways

#### "Knit Together"

I appeal to you, brothers, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree, and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same judgment. -1<sup>st</sup> Cor. 1:10

As if the pandemic, toilet paper shortages, murder hornets (whatever happened to those?), and everything else isn't enough, it's an election year. On the street I take into the church building, within a ½ mile of each other, are signs supporting a Republican candidate and one supporting a Democrat candidate—I always wonder what would happen if they sat down at the same dinner table together.

This year has been fraught with things that threaten to divide people—politics, health, safety, family—in addition to the things that 'normally' threaten to divide us—opinions, doctrine, interpretation, life in general. I don't know of anyone who would disagree that the church ought to be different, but I also wonder in truth just how different we are or aren't.

I've been dwelling on the verse above, particularly upon the word translated *united*. It's a neat word (many Greek words are) in that it is often translated "mend" or "completed", as in a project being worked upon. It comes from base words which mean to "adjust properly to be in good working order". If we take what this word means to heart, it tells us that unity isn't everyone agreeing upon one thing or another, but adjusting ourselves to work together to fully function according to our purpose. This is what the church should be—a group of people willing to adjust their mindsets, hearts, opinions, politics, whatever for the sake of working together with each other for the Kingdom.

In this season of much potential division, let us remember that by Christ's nails we've been knit together, and the responsibility to adjust to one another is our own. Let us keep that in mind as we navigate life's divisions to proclaim what true unity in diversity looks like, or what it at least could be like. "Also in Judah the hand of God was on the people to give them unity of mind to carry out what the king and his officials had ordered, following the word of the Lord" (2 Chronicles 30:12).

The story of Hezekiah delaying the Passover is very relevant in our time. For centuries, the Passover was celebrated on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of Nisan. However, due to national disasters (Assyria ransacking Jerusalem and King Ahaz's paganism) Hezekiah was not able to celebrate Passover on the traditional date. Not enough priests were purified and the country was in chaos. So they delayed Passover. Also, he sent out letters and heralds to everyone in North Israel imploring them to come to this late Passover feast. Many people came and it was the greatest Passover since the days of Solomon (2 Chronicles 30:26).

Sound familiar? We are also encountering a national disaster and learning to worship the Lord in new and unconventional ways. We've had to delay our large gatherings. Like Hezekiah, we are trying hard to connect with our brothers and sisters who have been separated from us due to a national disaster.

I have 2 prayers based on Hezekiah's Passover: 1) I pray God will give us <u>unity of mind</u> and help us to respect our leaders in this time. Satan wants to divide us in this time of crisis, but God wants to unite us. 2) I pray when the time is right to meet, we can return stronger than ever.
